

Kamuthini Primary School Photo Update, April 2015



The four door block of toilets were completed last month and are now in use. In addition to the block supported by York Businesses, Kamuthini were provided with a further block by the Rotary Club. This has dramatically improved the sanitation and hygiene conditions at the school for both pupils and teachers.

The teachers at the school have also noted the impact that the new classroom is having on its reputation in the community. Despite the challenges that the school faces, the teaching staff are remarkable in their enthusiasm and are looking forward to further improvements that can be made to their school to enhance the quality of education the children receive. One of these developments is that the government are planning to install electricity in the new classroom and administration block, opening up new opportunities for the school and community.

"The new latrine now ensures that teachers and pupils can now use separate facilities that are also safe. We no longer have to queue to use them during break time and there is also more privacy.
